

Scripture Memory 2016-2017

Aug. 11 Gen. 1:1-2

1. In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.
2. The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

Aug. 18 Gen. 1:3-5

3. Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light.
4. And God saw the light, that it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness.
5. God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. So the evening and the morning were the first day.

Aug. 25 Gen. 1:26-27

26. Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth."
27. So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

Sept. 1 Gen. 1:28-29

28. Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."
29. And God said, "See, I have given you every herb that yields seed which is on the face of all the earth, and every tree whose fruit yields seed; to you it shall be for food.

Sept. 8 Gen. 1:30-31

30. Also, to every beast of the earth, to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, in which there is life, I have given every green herb for food"; and it was so.
31. Then God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good. So the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

Sept. 15 Gen. 2: 1-3

1. Thus the heavens and the earth, and all the host of them, were finished.
2. And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done.
3. Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made.

Sept. 22 Gen. 2:15-17

15. Then the LORD God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to tend and keep it.
16. And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, "Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat;
17. but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."

Sept. 29 Gen. 2:18, 23-24

18. And the LORD God said, "It is not good that man should be alone; I will make him a helper comparable to him."
23. And Adam said: "This is now bone of my bones And flesh of my flesh; She shall be called Woman, Because she was taken out of Man."
24. Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh."

Oct. 6 Gen. 3:1-3

1. Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, "Has God indeed said, 'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden'?"
2. And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden;
3. but of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.'"

Oct. 13 Gen. 3:4-6

4. Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die.
5. For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil."
6. So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate.

Oct. 20 Gen. 3:7-9

7. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings.
8. And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.
9. Then the LORD God called to Adam and said to him, "Where are you?"

Oct. 27 Gen. 3:10-12

10. So he said, "I heard Your voice in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself."

11. And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you that you should not eat?"

12. Then the man said, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I ate."

Nov. 3 Gen. 3:13-14

13. And the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

14. So the LORD God said to the serpent: "Because you have done this, You are cursed more than all cattle, And more than every beast of the field; On your belly you shall go, And you shall eat dust All the days of your life."

Nov. 10 Gen. 3:15-16

15. And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel."

16. To the woman He said: "I will greatly multiply your sorrow and your conception; In pain you shall bring forth children; Your desire shall be for your husband, And he shall rule over you."

Nov. 17 Gen. 3:17-19

17. Then to Adam He said, "Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat of it': "Cursed is the ground for your sake; In toil you shall eat of it All the days of your life.

18. Both thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you, And you shall eat the herb of the field.

19. In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread Till you return to the ground, For out of it you were taken; For dust you are, And to dust you shall return."

Dec. 1 Deut. 5:6-8

6. 'I am the LORD your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.

7. 'You shall have no other gods before Me.

8. 'You shall not make for yourself a carved image—any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth;"

Dec. 8 Deut. 5:9-10

9. "you shall not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me,

10. but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments."

Dec. 15. Deut. 5:11-14a

11. 'You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain.
12. 'Observe the Sabbath day, to keep it holy, as the LORD your God commanded you.
13. Six days you shall labor and do all your work,
- 14a. but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD your God. In it you shall do no work...

Jan. 5. Deut. 5:16-19

16. 'Honor your father and your mother, as the LORD your God has commanded you, that your days may be long, and that it may be well with you in the land which the LORD your God is giving you.
17. 'You shall not murder.
18. 'You shall not commit adultery.
19. 'You shall not steal.

Jan. 12 Deut. 5:20-21

20. 'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.'
21. 'You shall not covet your neighbor's wife; and you shall not desire your neighbor's house, his field, his male servant, his female servant, his ox, his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's.'

Jan. 19 and Jan. 26 Ps. 1:1-6

1. Blessed is the man Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful;
2. But his delight is in the law of the LORD, And in His law he meditates day and night.
3. He shall be like a tree Planted by the rivers of water, That brings forth its fruit in its season, Whose leaf also shall not wither; And whatever he does shall prosper.
4. The ungodly are not so, But are like the chaff which the wind drives away.
5. Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, Nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.
6. For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, But the way of the ungodly shall perish.

Feb. 2 and Feb. 9 Ps. 15:1-5

1. LORD, who may abide in Your tabernacle? Who may dwell in Your holy hill?
2. He who walks uprightly, And works righteousness, And speaks the truth in his heart;
3. He who does not backbite with his tongue, Nor does evil to his neighbor, Nor does he take up a reproach against his friend;
4. In whose eyes a vile person is despised, But he honors those who fear the LORD; He who swears to his own hurt and does not change;
5. He who does not put out his money at usury, Nor does he take a bribe against the innocent. He who does these things shall never be moved.

Feb. 16 and Feb. 23**Ps. 23:1-6**

1. The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.
2. He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters.
3. He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake.
4. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.
5. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; My cup runs over.
6. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life; And I will dwell in the house of the LORD Forever.

Mar. 2**Ps. 34:1-4**

1. I Will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth.
2. My soul shall make its boast in the LORD; The humble shall hear of it and be glad.
3. Oh, magnify the LORD with me, And let us exalt His name together.
4. I sought the LORD, and He heard me, And delivered me from all my fears.

Mar. 9**Ps. 37:1-3**

1. Do not fret because of evildoers, Nor be envious of the workers of iniquity.
2. For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, And wither as the green herb.
3. Trust in the LORD, and do good; Dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness.

Mar. 23**Ps. 37:4-6**

4. Delight yourself also in the LORD, And He shall give you the desires of your heart.
5. Commit your way to the LORD, Trust also in Him, And He shall bring it to pass.
6. He shall bring forth your righteousness as the light, And your justice as the noonday.

Mar. 30 and Apr. 6**Ps. 100:1-5**

1. Make a joyful shout to the LORD, all you lands!
2. Serve the LORD with gladness; Come before His presence with singing.
3. Know that the LORD, He is God; It is He who has made us, and not we ourselves; We are His people and the sheep of His pasture.
4. Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, And into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name.
5. For the LORD is good; His mercy is everlasting, And His truth endures to all generations.”

Ps. 139:13-15

13. For You formed my inward parts; You covered me in my mother's womb.

14. I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Marvelous are Your works, And that my soul knows very well.
